Principal's Report: Mr. Joo's Update

- 1) Discussed our school action plan – the continued focus of social emotional learning. Mr. Joo has connected with Mr. Hunter regarding an 8 session series - 'ready to learn'.
- 2) Class placements is based on ministry set standards for grid. School teams work close together to set classes. Discussed the complexities of a smaller school regarding class placements, split classes and the dynamics of placement for next year classes. A lot of thought goes into this every year; the teachers will be working on this soon as we head towards the end of the year.
- 3) Lunch clubs – have started. They are a 4 week pilot project from April 17 through to May. This will inform the teachers on how it may look for next year.
- 4) School Wide write will be starting soon based around 'describing a time and a place where you felt like you belonged'. This will be linked to a story.
- 5) June 15th will be Sports Day. PAC to provide a juice box, hot dog, and possibly a concession.
- 6) Active beyond the bell – Mr. Joo has been in contact with Kim Anderson to see if there is a possibility for some before and after school care. Possibility of a pilot project at our school around this concept.
